JUNE 2025

The City Council approved the May 2025 Meeting Minutes on Monday, June 9, 2025.

Legislation: The City Council approved the following legislation:

Ordinance O-25-11 Amendment of Chapter 112-Noise to prohibit certain noises above a specified decibel 24 hours per day.

Ordinance O-25-12 Amendment of Chapter 1

107-Licensing and Permits to provide for Short-Term Rental Registration in the City.
Override Veto of Ordinance O-25-13 Adoption of Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget.

SEAT PLEASANT DAY UNITES RESIDENTS UNDER THE THEME: EMPOWERING INNOVATION, DRIVEN BY COMMUNITY

The City of Seat Pleasant brought its streets and parks to life with the energy of community pride, creativity, and collaboration during the annual Seat Pleasant Day celebration on Saturday, May 3rd 2025. This year's event, held under the theme "Empowered by Innovation, Driven by Community," drew hundreds of residents and visitors for a full day of festivities, connection, and joy.

The day began with a lively parade that stepped off from City Hall, traveled down Addison Road, and made its way to Martin Luther King Jr. Highway, culminating at Goodwin Park, where the main festival was held. Parade-goers were treated to a colorful procession featuring local marching bands, youth sports teams, small businesses, public safety officials, and Seat Pleasant's elected officials.

Other notable participants included the Ruff Rydaz Percussion Squad, the Charles Herbert Flowers High School Marching Band, local business Que's Quality Cars, and spirited performances from the Seat Pleasant Bobcats and the Dream Crushers Cheerleaders. The Walker Mill Middle School Cheer Squad also brought impressive routines that fired up the crowd.



WARD TWO TOWN HALL TALKS PUBLIC SAFETY & NEIGHBORHOOD COMPLIANCE

Council Member Hope Love hosted a Ward 2 Town Hall Meeting on Friday, April 11th, 2025 to bring residents together for open dialogue on key neighborhood issues. Acting Police Chief Cedric Heyward and Code Compliance Inspector Donald Grant answered questions about public safety, code enforcement, and new businesses in the area.



Residents also heard greetings from County Council Member Krystal Oriadha and representatives from the Prince George's County State's Attorney's Office, who shared updates on county-wide justice initiatives. The event fostered transparency, connection, and collaboration between community members and local leaders.

THREE MUNICIPALITIES: ONE SHARED VISION

On May 17, 2025, history was made as Mayor Kelly Porter of Seat Pleasant, Mayor Linda Monroe of Capitol Heights, and Mayor Akiaba Stewart of Fairmount Heights came together for a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signing, signaling a united commitment to advance economic development along the western portion of the Blue Line Corridor.

Held in the spirit of collaboration and shared vision, the event featured remarks from State Delegate Jazz Lewis, Council Member Jolene Ivey, and Delegate Tiffany Alston, and included a special proclamation from the Office of the Prince George's County Executive.

With the support of LISC DC and The Capital Market of 20743, the three historic municipalities committed to working together to craft legislation, build a shared identity, and attract businesses and equitable development to the region.

This historic partnership reflects a renewed commitment to strengthening the 20743 community through smart, inclusive growth and intergovernmental cooperation.
